

senator = a member of the house or chamber of a legislature called a senate.

<u>party</u> = a political group group considered as a formal whole, united under one specific political platform of issues and campaigning to take part in government.

elect = choose a candidate by popular vote.

president = the head of state of a republic.

candidate = a person who is running in an election.
